
## **Fundraisers**



Thanks to Cyd Charrow the Book Club is up and running each month using the computer platform ZOOM.

In September we had a round robin discussion of our favorite summer reads.

In October we will discuss the historical fiction book, <u>Tidelands</u> by <u>Philippa Gregory</u>, a favorite book club author. Set in 1648 during the English Civil War when the people of England united to control the power of the English King, it is a turning point for the men and women, especially the women of England. The main character, Alinor, a herbalist and midwife, reflects the moralities and changes of the time.

November brings us closer to home with the book, <u>Suncoast Empire: Bertha Honore Palmer. Her Family and the Rise of Sarasota</u> by Frank Cassell. In the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, Bertha Palmer was one of the best-known and wealthiest women in America. In 1910 she traveled to the small settlement called Sarasota. She decided to spend much of her time in one of America's last frontier investing her resources in the development of the west coast of Florida. Her influence was felt from Venice north to Tampa.

In November the committee plans to deliver Walmart gift cards for one family at each of the above three schools, as identified by the counselors. We hope these cards will contribute to a fulfilling Thanksgiving dinner for these families.

Even though ABWC is not meeting "in-person" for our luncheons this fall, the committee thought we should continue our tradition of providing Angel Tree gifts to families at each of the above three local elementary schools.

#### **Angel Tree Gifts**

Since the committee members will not be able to bring a list of families and their requested gifts for the Angel Tree to a November luncheon or have members bring their gifts to a December luncheon, an alternative way to assign and collect the gifts has been developed.

- Club members are to email the committee, Rebecca or Mary Lou, if interested in participating.
- Once the lists of families and their requested gifts are received, Rebecca and Mary Lou will email a list of assignments of gifts to those who have indicated they would like to participate. These assignments will be made the second week in November.
- ◆ Please let Rebecca or Mary Lou know within a week, if you will not be able to buy the gift assigned.
- Once the assignment list is finalized, they will send a follow-up email to all participants.
- The second week in December, members will bring the gifts to the Northside Parking Lot of the Publix Shopping Center at Rte. 41 and 19th Ave. (date and time to be determined and included in the final assignment e-mail). All gifts must be wrapped and clearly marked as to the recipient and the recipient's school. There will be three cars there, clearly marked with the name of the school to which the gifts will be taken. Committee members will be there with the list of assignments, as well as name tags, in case there is any confusion.

The Club's hope is to continue to be able to support families in need of assistance in our community during the holiday season. The committee members have done their best to develop a process that hopefully will result in a successful Angel Tree project.

**2020 General Election\* Deadline to register:** Monday, October 5, 2020

Early Voting: October 19 - November 1, 7 a.m. - 7 p.m., Election Day: November 3, 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. Vote-By-Mail ballots will be sent out on September 24. Vote-By-Mail may be dropped off at early voting sites or on election day at Falkenburg or Riverview offices by 7 p.m. on Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> (Florida State Law).

The Ballot is a 2 - page ballot (3 pages) with 6 amendments; sample ballot can be found on HCSOE website.


