#### Bake Sale 2021


#### Ladies,


Our Club activities will be resuming in January, 2021 and we look forward to doing some activities to help raise some money for worthy students. — *Sharon Vasquez*



Lists of requested gifts were received from the three elementary schools mentioned above, and gifts were assigned to those who had indicated via e-mail that they were interested in participating.

- At 9:30 on December 10, wrapped gifts will be delivered to Committee members at the parking lot at the Publix shopping center at U. S. 41 and 19th Ave and then taken to the schools.
- **Very important, gifts must be labeled with age and gender of the student, and also the appropriate school!**

We are very grateful to all who chose to participate this year, and understand that it is not "business as usual". But then, very little during this worldwide pandemic is. Thank you very much, as always, for your generosity.

In February we plan to have our annual collection of food for "Backpacks on a Mission," a program sponsored by South Shore United Methodist Church that provides food for weekends (breakfast, lunch, dinner and a snack for each day) for students who counselors have identified as being food insufficient. This program began in 2012, providing food for 25 students at one school. Currently, food is provided to 136 students at four schools. ABWC's past food collections have contributed to the success of this program and have been greatly appreciated. A list of requested foods will be distributed at the January luncheon.


